EOEF PRESIDENTIAL GUEST SPEAKERJavad Parvizi, MD FRCS

The EOA is pleased to welcome Dr. Javad Parvizi as the 2024 Presidential Guest Speaker. Dr. Parvizi is Professor of Orthopedic Surgery at Acibadem University, Emeritus Professor at Thomas Jefferson University, Founder and CEO of Parvizi Surgical Innovation, Co-Founder of International Joint Center, and Co-Founder of International Consensus Group.

He specializes in the management of young patients with hip disorders such as dysplasia, femoroacetabular impingement and other complex hip and knee conditions. He is a renowned world expert in the field of periprosthetic joint infection, joint preservation, and joint reconstruction, and has performed over 10,000 joint procedures including over 1,100 preservation surgeries (femoroacetabular osteoplastypelvic and femoral osteotomies).

Today, he continues to help patients of any age, performing hundreds of hip and knee replacements and revision surgeries per year.

Dr. Parvizi is a recent president of the American Association of Hip and Knee Surgeons and has served as the president of Musculoskeletal Infection Society (2013), Eastern Orthopedic Association (2018) and holds positions on the board of numerous organizations and societies.

HOWARD STEEL LECTURER Rick Atkinson

The EOA is pleased to welcome author, Rick Atkinson, as the 2024 Howard Steel Lecturer. Rick Atkinson is a historian and the author, most recently, of The British Are Coming: The War for America, Lexington to Princeton, 1775-1777, published in May 2019 as the first volume in his Revolution Trilogy. The book spent nearly three months on the New York Times bestseller list.



Atkinson is also the author of seven other books, including the Liberation Trilogy about the role of the U.S. military during World War II in the Mediterranean and Western European theaters. The first volume of that series, An Army at Dawn: The War in North Africa, 1942-1943, received the Pulitzer Prize for history and was acclaimed by the Wall Street Journal as "the best World War II battle narrative since Cornelius Ryan's classics, The Longest Day and A Bridge Too Far." The second volume, The Day of Battle: The War in Sicily and Italy, 1943-1944, drew praise from the New York Times as "a triumph of narrative history, elegantly written...and rooted in the sight and sounds of battle." The final volume, The Guns at Last Light: The War in Western Europe, 1944-1945, ranked #1 on the New York Times bestseller list. The Wall Street Journal called it "a magnificent book," and the New York Times Book Review described it as "a tapestry of fabulous richness and complexity...The Liberation Trilogy is a monumental achievement."

Born in Munich, Germany, Atkinson is the son of a U.S. Army officer and grew up on military posts. He holds a Master of Arts degree in English literature from the University of Chicago. He worked as a reporter, foreign correspondent, and senior editor for more than 20 years at the Washington Post. Among his many other awards are the 1982 Pulitzer Prize for national reporting, and the 1999 Pulitzer Prize for public service, awarded to the Post for investigative articles directed and edited by Atkinson on shootings by District of Columbia police officers. In 2020, The British Are Coming won the George Washington Prize for the year's best work on the American founding era; the New-York Historical Society's Barbara and David Zalaznick Book Prize, awarded annually to the best work in the field of American history and biography; and the "Excellence in American History Book Award" of the Daughters of the American Revolution. The second volume of the Revolution Trilogy, The Fate of the Day: The War for America, Ticonderoga to Charleston, 1777-1780, is scheduled for publication in May 2025.

Atkinson lives in Washington, D.C., with his wife, Dr. Jane C. Atkinson, a researcher and clinician at the National Institutes of Health. They have two grown children, Dr. Sarah J. Atkinson, a colorectal surgeon in Seattle, and Rush Atkinson, associate deputy attorney general of the United States.

IN MEMORY Bill Walton



We are sad to hear of Bill Walton's recent passing on May 27th. As last year's Presidential Guest Speaker, he delighted attendees with an entertaining talk, "What Great Coaches Taught Me About Leadership."

Before he was a beloved, eccentric color commentator for the NBA, Bill Walton earned respect as an all-time great on the court. Born in La Mesa, California, Walton was a star center in high school who helped lead his squad to 49 consecutive wins and two straight championships. He went on to UCLA, where he won three straight national college player of the year awards, helped the team go on an 88-game winning streak, and lead them to championships in 1972 and 1973.

Walton was the first overall pick in the 1974 NBA draft, going to the Portland Trail Blazers and quickly excelling on the professional level, too. He helped the Blazers nab a championship in 1977, then, the following year, won the league MVP award. Injuries hobbled the rest of his career — including years spent on his hometown team, the San Diego Clippers — but in 1986, he won his second championship with the Boston Celtics, playing as a solid back-up.

Though he struggled with a stutter until he was nearly 30, Walton overcame his condition and went into TV broadcasting after his playing days were over. At various times, he provided color commentary for all three major networks — ABC, CBS, and NBC — as well as ESPN. He was known for his offbeat approach and sense of humor, becoming a favorite among fans and players alike.

Walton won an Emmy Award in 2001 for his broadcasting work. He is in the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame, National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame, the California Sports Hall of Fame, and UCLA Athletics Hall of Fame, among others. In 1996, he was named one of the top 50 players in history by a panel of media, players, coaches, and executives.
